DENTAL ENGINES.

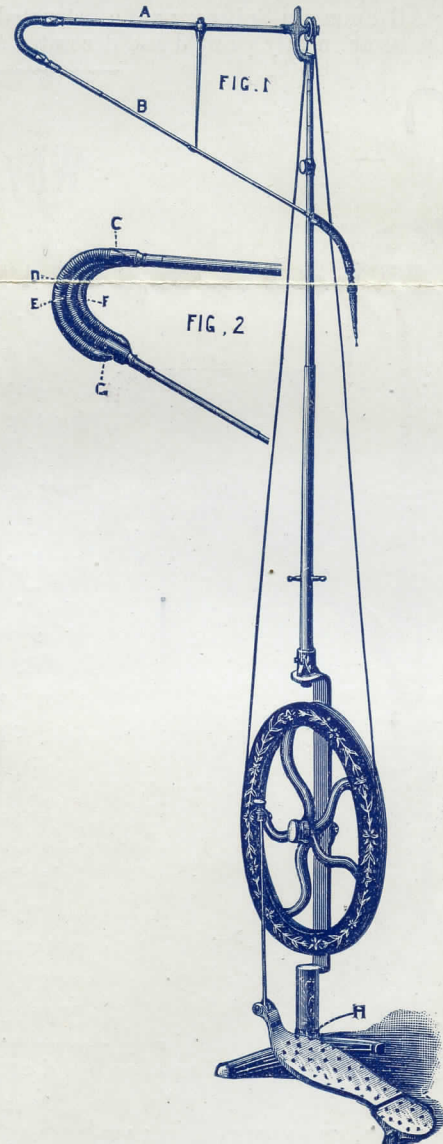


THE WILCOX DENTAL ENGINE.

The base is of the well known tripod style, which adapts itself to the unevenness of the floor and carries a wheel 12½ inches in diameter. The standard is rigid and telescopes at the top, allowing the taking up of the slack belt, and is held rigid by a binding screw. To the top of this standard is swivelled a horizontal arm, having a swinging motion at right angles to the standard, and to its outer end is connected a fore-arm, by means of a tripple, flexible, spring joint. Great strength and delicacy are combined in this construction without a multitude of joints and pivots to become worn out and loose. It also allows the fore arm great freedom in its movements without being limited. The mode of connecting is without doubt the best ever used on a dental engine, as it is impossible to kink the spiral driving spring. The hand piece is connected to the fore arm by a second duplex spring joint. We believe the workmanship and wearing qualities will conform with the best dental engines made, as all our engines are put up complete and are subjected to the most severe tests before they are put on sale.

THE DUPLEX CORD DENTAL ENGINE.

The working parts and arrangement of this engine are fully shown in the accompanying cuts (made from photographs) and it needs only a casual glance to convince the most skeptical that the "Duplex Cord" is built on the most scientific principles, as to correct arrangement of its working parts; or to insuring convenience to the operator and wearing qualities to the engine.

It has been the object of the inventor of this engine to give the bit a steady, free motion, and to overcome the "back lash" so common in engines of other manufacturers.

Novel ideas as to construction abound in this engine, and nothing has been overlooked to make it complete in every particular.

A few desirable features of our Duplex Cord Engines:

1. A belt wheel and fly wheel combined, which insures a steady motion over the dead center.
2. Rubber pads on treadle, to prevent foot slipping.
3. Attaching the pedestal to the feet by cap-screws making it easily put together, or taken apart for shipment.
4. Drive wheel on opposite side of pedestal from the pitman, so an endless driving cord can be put on or off, without taking engine apart, or cutting cord.
5. Pivottally attaching the arm to standard so as to fold it down against, or raise to nearly a vertical position, out of the way of the operator; also to make it convenient for a high or low chair.
6. Using two cords instead of one; this feature obviates a long cord also running cord around so many pulleys and insures an easy movement and a free and steady motion to the bit.
7. Obtaining two different speeds for the bit, with the same velocity of the driving wheel.

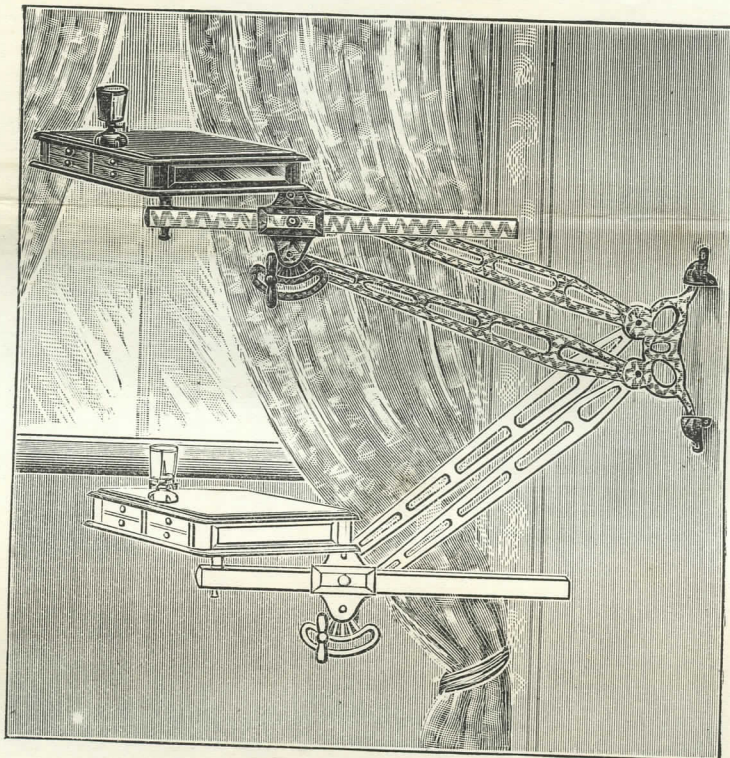

5. Have your mouth thoroughly examined by your dentist semi-annually, and do not say yourself what teeth can, and cannot, be saved; large dental bills and acute pain would be avoided by frequent visits.
6. Live as natural as you can.
7. The teeth are apt to resist decay in proportion as they are regular, therefore have them regulated early in life.
8. If there is any disturbance in the body resulting from bad teeth, or if there is any trouble about the mouth, don't consult a physician but always an educated dentist.
9. If you can't brush the teeth but once a day do it the last thing before retiring.

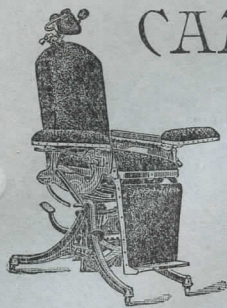


Fig. I—Normal.

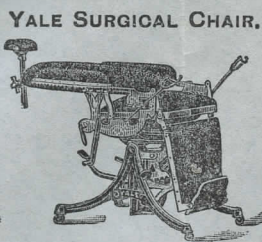


Fig. XVII—Dorsal, (Drop Seat.)

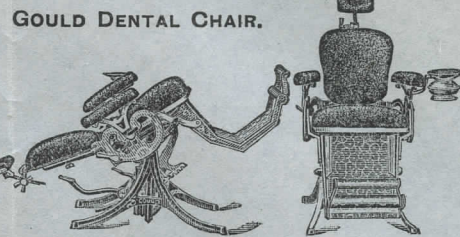


Fig. XIV—Chloroform Narcosis.

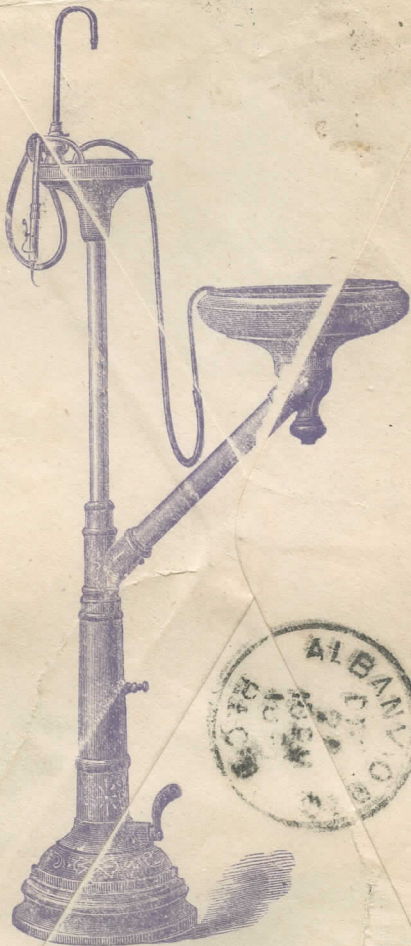

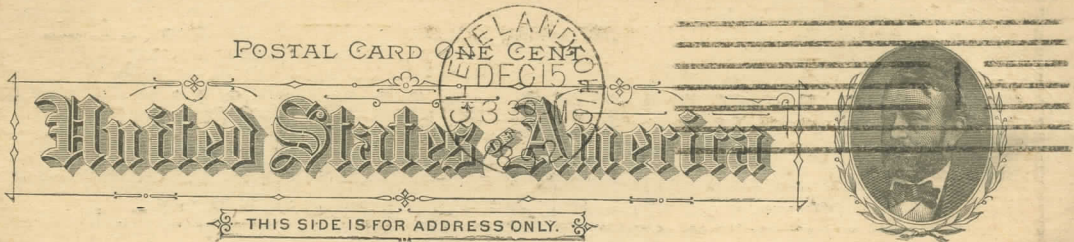

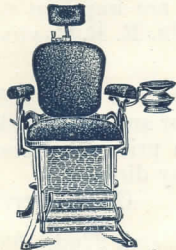


Fig. II—Normal.

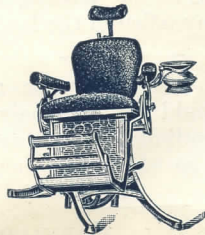


Fig. IV—Right Lateral Tilt.

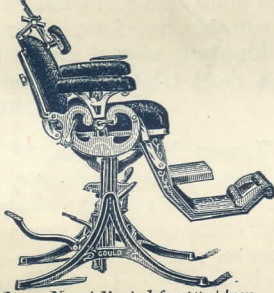


Fig. X—Adjusted for Children.

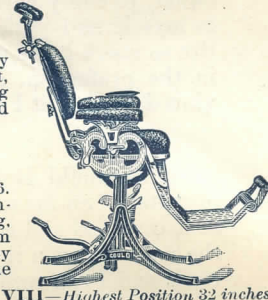


Fig. VIII—Highest Position 32 inches.

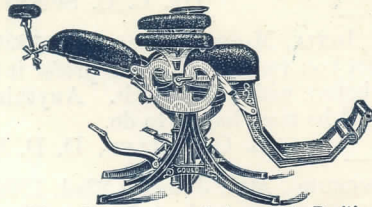


Fig. XII—Horizontal Anæsthetic Position.

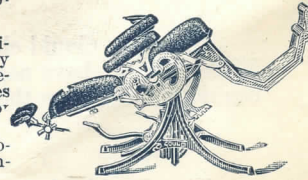


Fig. XIV—Chloroform Narcosis Position.
