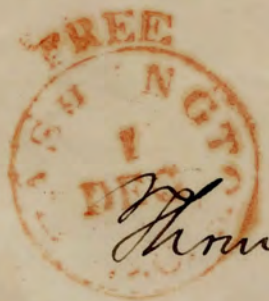

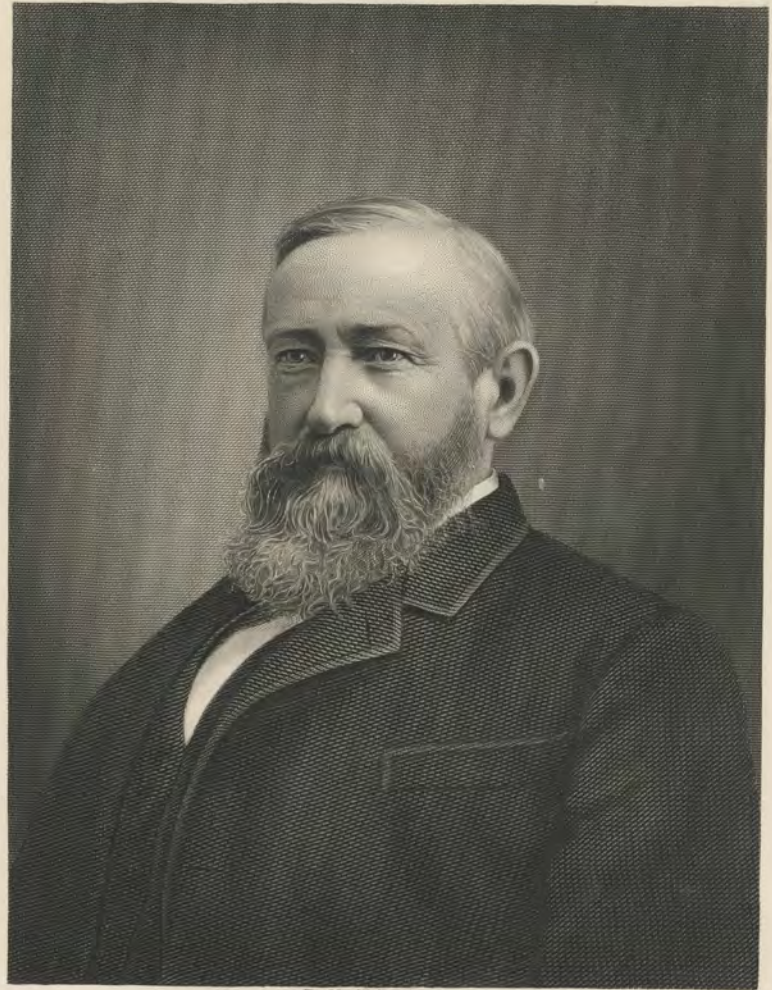

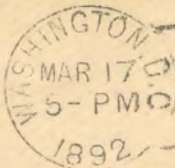

Know Ye That reposing special trust and confidence in the patriotism, valor, fidelity, and abilities of Charles Simmons I ~~have nominated, and by and with the advice and consent of the Senate~~ do appoint him Second Lieutenant in the Tenth Regiment of Infantry in the service of the United States: to rank as such from the ninth day of April eighteen hundred and forty seven. He is therefore carefully and diligently to discharge the duty of Second Lieutenant by doing and performing all manner of things thereunto belonging. And I do strictly charge, and require all Officers and Soldiers under his command, to be obedient to his orders as Second Lieutenant. And he is to observe and follow such orders, and directions, from time to time, as he shall receive from me, or the future President of the United States of America, or the General, or other superior Officers set over him, according to the rules and discipline of War. This Commission to continue in force during the pleasure of the President of the United States, for the time being.

GIVEN under my hand, at the City of Washington, this twenty sixth day of May in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and forty seven and in the seventy first year of the Independence of the United States.

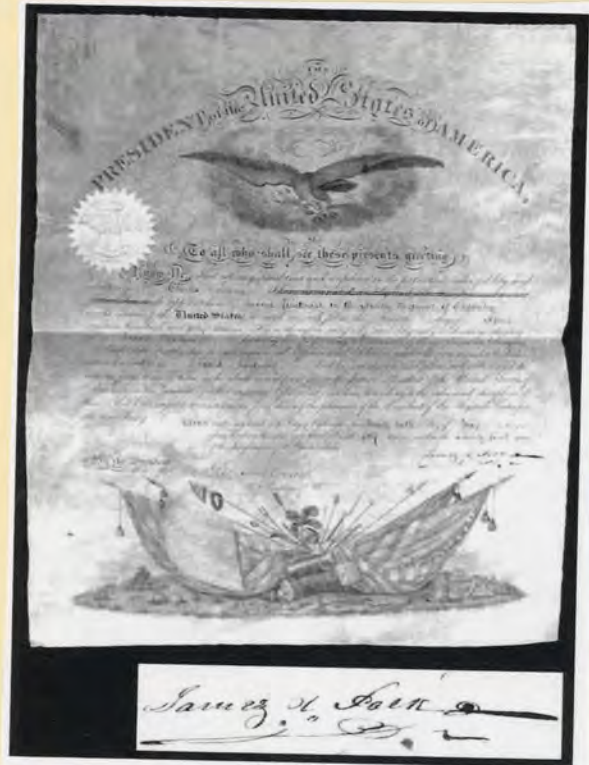

Marcy the Secretary of War, dated May 26, 1847, very attractive with an eagle vignette at T. and a multiple flags vignette at B., there are a couple of folds and some tone spots but the overall appearance of this document is Extremely Fine and exceptionally attractive, Polk signatures are extremely rare & seldom offered on any item any where, (Estimate 3,000-4,000)--
